

FRENCH AIRMAN.

ARRIVAL AT FREMANTLE

DEMONSTRATIONS IN AUSTRALIA

(Reuter's Telegram).

Fremantle, March 31.

Interviewed aboard the Orontow today, Maurice Guillaux, a French airman, announced his intention of giving exhibitions of flying in Australia, including side-slipping, tail slipping, looping the loop, upside down flying, and perpendicular diving, in order to demonstrate that an aviator in a good machine, at a proper altitude, is perfectly safe. He does not believe in the automatic stability of aeroplanes.

Guillaux intends to fly from Melbourne to Sydney. He says any attempted aerial passage of the Atlantic this year would be foolhardiness, as no present-day machine is equal to the task.
