**AUSTRALIAN JOCKEY CLUB.**

The following additions and alterations to the Rules of Racing have been passed by the Committee, and will come into force on 1st AUGUST, 1914:—

10 (a). IF any two-year-old run at any unregistered meeting before the 1st day of October in each year, such horse and the owner, lessee, trainer, and rider thereof, shall be disqualified for all races at any registered meeting.

11. SUBSTITUTE the word "three" for the word "two" in line three.

14 (a). AFTER the word "Sydney" in line six, add the words "and may also from time to time appoint any number of persons not exceeding three, not being Members of such Committee, to act as Stewards at any Registered Meeting held within a radius of forty miles from the principal Post Office in Newcastle."

15. AFTER the word "Sydney," in line three, add the words "and outside a radius of forty miles from the principal Post Office, Newcastle."

61. AFTER the word "horse," in the last line, add the words, "When the amount of the added money exceeds £20, the minimum amount of the Sweepstake shall be £10."

87 (a). IN line eight, after the figures "30" to "40,"

87 (b). ANY apprentice who shall have obtained permission to ride in races from the Newcastle Registration Board shall be entitled, during a period of three years from the date of receiving such permission while his apprenticeship continues, to claim in any handicap flat race (not being a race for two-year-olds only), run at any meeting within a radius of 40 miles from the principal Post Office, Newcastle, the added money to which does not exceed 125 sovs., an allowance on the following scale, viz:—

Until he shall have ridden five winners	7lb.
after receiving such permission	7lb.
If he shall have ridden five winners until he shall have ridden ten winners as aforesaid	5lb.
If he shall have ridden ten winners until he shall have ridden twenty winners as aforesaid	3lb.

PROVIDED that for the purpose of ascertaining the number of winners ridden by any apprentice for the purpose of this rule an apprentice who shall have ridden in a dead heat and shall have ridden the winner of the run-off, shall be deemed to have ridden one winner only in respect of such race.

118 (a). ALL horses intended to be run in any race, shall be brought into the Saddling Paddock at least one hour immediately preceding the time appointed for the starting of such race, and shall remain there until the time shall have arrived to proceed to the starting point.

171 (c). ANY person who shall at any time administer or cause to be administered for the purpose of affecting the speed, stamina, or course of a horse by any drug or stimulant whatever except by permission of the stewards, and subject to such conditions as they may impose.
