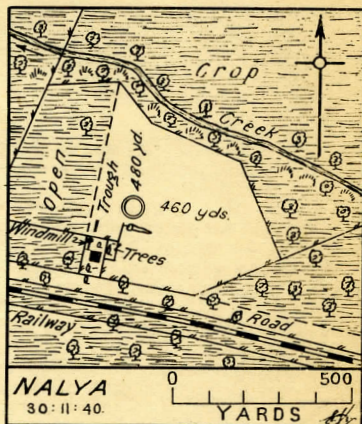
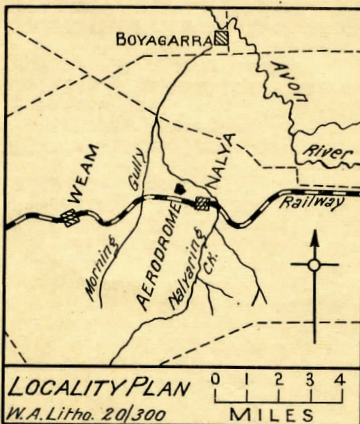


## DATA SHEET FOR LANDING GROUND NO.320

NALYA, W.A.

(REVISED - JANUARY, 1941)

LICENSED AERODROME, "C" CLASS



LATITUDE: 32°23' S. LONGITUDE: 117°12' E. MAG. VAR. 5 W. app.  
 ALTITUDE: 600 feet approx.  
 POSITION:  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile west of Nalya siding on north side of Brooktown-Corrigin railway line.  
 RELEVANT AVIATION MAP: Mercator Sheet J.3.  
 SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Open agricultural land where forced landings may possibly be made.  
 LANDMARKS: Nalgaring Creek to north, railway line and road to south. House at SW corner.  
 APPROACHES: North - scattered timber along creek. East and south - scattered timber. West - open.  
 MARKINGS: White circle and wind indicator.  
 DIMENSIONS: N-S, 480 yards; E-W, 460 yards.  
 SURFACE: Good generally, but liable to rabbit burrows on north side.

TOWN: Brookton, 12 miles west.

RAILWAY STATION: Nalya siding,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile east.

TELEPHONE: Nalya P.O. (Mr. F.H. Boulton's house near SW corner).

HANGARS: Nil.

REPAIRS: Limited resources at house garage.

REFUELLING: Brookton, 12 miles west.

WATER: At house.

PROPRIETOR: Mr. Boulton, Morning Valley, Nalya, W.A.

CHARGES: Nil at present.

SPECIAL REMARKS: As aerodrome is used for grazing stock, pilots should notify Mr. Boulton beforehand of their intention to land.
