

**KILLED IN CRASH**

MELBOURNE, Thursday.—Four R.A.A.F. men were killed when a Service aircraft crashed in the Gippsland area on Tuesday.

They were:—  
 Squadron-Leader James William McGilvray, 31, married, of Wagga, N.S.W.

Sergeant Ernest Douglas Bayley, 20, of Dubbo, N.S.W.

Sergeant-Observer Murdoch John Gawith, 23, of Murtoa, Vic.

Sergeant Frank Rupert Walton, 28, of Middle Park, Vic.

Cause of the accident is unknown. Squadron-Leader McGilvray, who was born at Young, N.S.W., was a member of the permanent Air Force. He was a student at the Sydney University when he enlisted in November, 1929.

Sergeant-Observer Gawith was born at Horsham, but before enlistment in March of last year he lived at Murtoa. In private life he was a clothier.

Sergeant Walton was born at Geelong. Before enlistment he was an accountant, and lived at Middle Park.

Sergeant Bayley was born at Dubbo, N.S.W. At the time of his enlistment, in July of last year, he was a wood-worker.
