

FOUR DEAD IN R.A.A.F. CRASH

Two Victorian members of the R.A.A.F., another from N.S.W. and a fourth from Western Australia were killed in an air crash in southern N.S.W. during bad visibility and weather conditions.

THEY were: Sergeant Norman Baxter Clark (22), single, Wembley Park, Western Australia; Flight-Sergeant Bernard James Hubbard (26), married, Bentleigh, Victoria; Sergeant Geoffrey Alfred Rich (25), married, Rockdale; Sergeant Joseph Hall Iredale (26), married, Hamilton, Victoria.

Sergeant Rich, who was born at Goulburn, enlisted in 1941 and was trained in Australia as a wireless-airgunner. Before his enlistment he was a business manager.

Sergeant Clark was a university student before enlisting. Flight-Sergeant Hubbard was a dairyman and Sergeant Iredale a grazier.
