

A. RMAN KILLED IN CRASH.

Two Planes Collide.

MELBOURNE, Friday.
 Flying-Officer B. G. Jones, 35, formerly of Hobart, Tasmania, has been killed in an aircraft accident at a training school at Western Junction, Tasmania. Two planes collided as they were leaving the aerodrome on training flights.
 Flying-Officer Jones had as passenger Leading Aircraftman D. S. Brown, of Melbourne, who sustained a fractured arm. The pilot of the other aircraft was not hurt.
 Flying-Officer Jones was a solicitor in Hobart before he enlisted in the Air Force in January, 1940.
