

**PLANES COLLIDE
IN AIR**
**Two Killed Near
Junee**

Two airmen were killed yesterday when two training machines collided at a height of about 3,000ft during a training flight near Junee. Two other airmen parachuted to safety.

The victims were:—
Flight-Sergeant William Hisketh Jones, aged 22, single, instructor, formerly of Hectorville (S.A.).
Leading Aircraftman Vivian Vickers, 22, single, trainee, formerly of Wilmot, Mount Larcom (Q.).
The crew of the second plane, who bailed out, were Flight-Sergeant Ben Weston, instructor, and Leading Aircraftman James Kyte Oliver, trainee. Oliver was slightly injured.
Both planes, which were from the flying training school at Wagga, crashed, and were totally destroyed.
Flight-Sergeant Jones was employed as a jackeroo before he enlisted. Leading Aircraftman Vickers came originally from Stratford, New Zealand. He was a grazier before enlistment.
