

TWO KILLED IN R.A.A.F. CRASH

An officer and an aircraftman were killed on Sunday afternoon when a plane crashed near Tamworth while on a training flight from an R.A.A.F. station in N.S.W.

They were:

Flight-Lieutenant Cedar Alfred Dawson, married, of Drummoyne. Commissioned in June, 1940, he was a flying instructor.

L.A.C. Gordon Patterson, 27, single, of Currabubula, New South Wales. He enlisted in June, 1941.

The plane was destroyed. Cause of the crash is unknown.
