

Plane Crashes Into River: Two Killed

Two airmen were killed when an R.A.A.F. plane on a training flight from a New South Wales air station crashed into the Hawkesbury River near Windsor.

They were:—

Flight-Sergeant Edwin Ray Bassett, 21, single, of Oakleigh, Melbourne, pilot,
Sergeant Allen Marten Blackburn, 22, single, of St. Kilda, Melbourne, observer.

The plane hit some telephone wires before diving into the river. It was destroyed.
