Two Die In Air Collision

Pilots of two planes were killed near Sydney when their aircraft collided nearly 6000 feet up during exercises.

The pilots were:—

Sergeant Colin Cameron Martin, 23, of Strathfield;

Sergeant Gordon Ronald Campbell, 21, of Drummoyne.

An eyewitness of the crash said that one plane smashed into the rear of the other.

Two occupants of one plane bailed out, but only one was seen to jump from the other.

As the planes were falling, the shattered rear portion broke away and struck one of the descending airmen.

This man died a few minutes after landing.

The other pilot was killed when his plane crashed.

One of the planes burst into flames soon after hitting the ground. It landed on a fowl shed on a poultry farm, and many of the fowls were killed. The shed was set afire.
