

**TWO KILLED IN
R.A.A.F. CRASH**

A flying-officer and an aircraftman were killed on Tuesday when a plane from an R.A.A.F. station at Canberra crashed near Williamtown (N.S.W.).

The men were: Flying-Officer Stanley Eric Ross, 21, single, formerly of Nedlands (W.A.), and John Keith MacDonald Brown, 32, married, formerly of Campsie.

Pilot-Officer Ross enlisted in Perth in August, 1941.

He passed through the R.A.A.F. training school at Somers (Vic.) and received his elementary flying training at Western Junction (Tasmania) and Point Cook (Vic.).

Aircraftman Brown enlisted in Sydney in June, 1941. He was a pay clerk at R.A.A.F. headquarters at Williamtown.
